## Program

Paul Solyn is executive director of the Jewish Center & Federation of the Twin Tiers in Elmira, NY however his topic today was about Climate Change – the good and the bad. Paul mentioned that last summer was the hottest summer on record worldwide. He talked about how people view the issues with climate change with 28% of the population being Alarmed, 29% Concerned, 15% Cautious, 11% Doubtful, 11% Dismissive and 6% Disengaged. Over the past few years, the Alarmed & Concerned groups have increased while the doubtful & dismissive have decreased. He talked about tax credits being available for certain energy efficient changes to their residences especially things such as solar panels and heat pumps. New York Residents can get Home Equity Audits for free. He also talked about electric cars and although they are getting more popular the infrastructure for charging the cars is lacking. There are limited charging stations in this area with a few by Elm Chevrolet, West Elmira Town Hall, Simmons Rockwell and near the Airport.
