Program

Today's Program was Marc Witt, General Manager of the Elmira Pioneers which is in the Perfect Game Collegiate Baseball League. Marc began his career in Elmira with the Elmira Jackals and then moved to Oklahoma City and then to the Columbus Blue Jackets and then to Binghamton to the Binghamton Senators hockey team. He began working again with Robbie Nichols (his father-in-law) in the summers for the Pioneers and then became General Manager.

All the players must be NCAA eligible and range in age from 18-24. Eligible players must have remaining college eligibility or be a high-level graduate with MLB scout interest for the late July MLB draft. Graduated high school seniors that will attend a two-year or four-year college in the fall are also eligible, subject to Perfect Game USA approval, with a limit of four per team. The team plays 23 away games and 26 home games per season. The Pioneers have made it to the championship game for the past two years only to lose in the final game. Can-USA sports which owns the Pioneers also owns the Batavia Muckdogs and the Niagara Falls Americans which are in the same league. Baseball has been at Dunn Field since 1888. The attendance at the games ranks the Pioneers as the 6th highest in attendance of the 169 teams!


